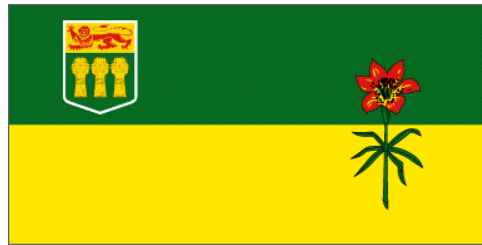

The Sympto-thermal test as taught by Serena is extremely effective as a method of pregnancy prevention, yet free of side effects commonly associated with other contraceptive methods. Fertility awareness information is also beneficial for those planning a pregnancy or experiencing difficulty conceiving. Also provides LAM information and instruction for postpartum and Breastfeeding women. There are also five satellite centres in Moose Jaw, Yorkton, Swift Current, Prince Albert and North Battleford.
